In this lecture, Dr. Bowman will encompass facial esthetics, Class II combination therapy, the butterfly system, crossbite corrections, Monkey Hooks, Kilroy Springs, Class II mechanics, distal jet, Invisalign, miniscrews, as well as demineralization stains. These topics and more will be covered in vignettes spread throughout the morning and afternoon.
