This one day conference will cover topics including updates in treatment options, supportive care, patient issues, and social determinants of health. This conference is designed for physicians, nurses, advanced practice professionals, and others involved with lung cancer who have an interest in the management of quality of life challenges for lung cancer survivors as well as current lung cancer therapies and multidisciplinary management.

- Recognize EBIs appropriate for specific geographic areas based on ruggedness, rurality, and other small area catchment data characteristics,
- Discuss timing of molecular biomarker testing,
- Recognize the difference between the different types of oligometastatic disease, and
- Evaluate the effectiveness of using Facebook-targeted advertisement to engage and motivate high-risk individuals to complete lung cancer screening.
